WHEREAS, American Airlines and US Airways approved a historic merger agreement in February 2013 creating the world's largest airline, which required the negotiation of a joint collective bargaining agreement for the Flight Attendants of both carriers; and

WHEREAS, the Joint Collective Bargaining Agreement (JCBA) includes a negotiated Implementation Letter; and

WHEREAS, the JCBA contains countless improvements for APFA members worth millions of dollars annually for both LAA and LUS Flight Attendants; and

WHEREAS, the APFA entered into the implementation of the JCBA in good faith expecting that the Company would meet its commitments; and

WHEREAS, the Company has failed to deliver in a timely manner numerous items affecting all American Airlines Flight Attendants, despite the continuous, vigorous efforts of APFA's Joint Scheduling Implementation Committee; and

WHEREAS, the delay has been essentially caused by the Company's choosing to give Flight Attendants less priority on its corporate list of merger integration items; and

WHEREAS, these delays have created measurable negative economic, work rule and quality of work life impacts on Flight Attendants; and

WHEREAS, American Airlines has earned record profits since 2014 and has offered no plan to fairly compensate or make APFA members whole; and

WHEREAS, the membership is still waiting for the decision in the Wage Adjustment arbitration; and

WHEREAS, Flight Attendants have worked tirelessly to contribute to the success of the merged company, and expect the Company to deliver on the agreed-upon improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Company has asked the APFA Board of Directors to meet in April 2017 to review the Company's modified implementation timelines;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, after that meeting, the APFA Board of Directors shall convene to consider the appropriate next steps for APFA to take, including potential legal action.
