To Whom It May Concern:

We understand there may be questions about the pension plan US Airways, Inc. once sponsored for its flight attendants, and this letter provides an explanation of the current status of this plan.

The Retirement Plan for Flight Attendants in the Service of US Airways, Inc. (“Flight Attendant Pension Plan”) terminated on January 10, 2005 as a result of US Airways Inc.’s bankruptcy. This termination meant that US Airways, Inc.’s obligations for the Flight Attendant Pension Plan ended, and all responsibilities for the Flight Attendant Pension Plan were assumed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (“PBGC”), the federal agency that insures pension benefits for American workers. The PBGC is the trustee of the Flight Attendant Pension Plan and is the sole entity responsible for the administration and payment of benefits from the Plan.
